The UCD Quinn School is a progressive and engaging environment, which places a strong emphasis on independent thought.

The experience of studying here is like no other. You will work with ambitious business students from around the world. You will meet some of the world's leading employers and interact with leading research-active lecturers. Our focus is not only on providing education, but also on the skills necessary to succeed in the working world. Our School is a community-focused epicentre on the UCD campus for our students, and a space purpose built for business education, formal and informal connecting, collaborating and continuous development.



COLLABORATION STUDIOS

Our collaboration studios have the latest audiovisual technology to train and practice your presentation and communication skills. In these spaces you can record and practice your pitches and presentations for group work or as interview preparation.

EXTENSIVE CO-WORKING SPACES

At the heart of the Quinn School is the idea of belonging, collaboration, co-working and side-by-side learning, inside and outside the classroom. Areas such as the Moore Atrium contain a rich mix of solo and collaborative working and social spaces for our students.

KPMG SKILLS ZONE

The KPMG Zone supports professional and personal development, as well as skill-building activity, experiences and opportunities for transformational learning and real workplace skill development. Co-located is the Data Analytics Lab which hosts Bloomberg terminals providing access to the premier professional tools used in financial, investment, treasury, business research and data analytics industries.

THINK LAB

Our Think Lab is a 16-person dedicated space for hands-on experimentation, problem solving and design thinking focused on innovation and teamwork. Designed to mimic the future of work in collaborative teams, the space is equipped with the tools needed for successful group work.

EY ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION HUB

MEDIA SUITE

Recording studios and editing suites provide opportunities and support to extend digital content and creator skills in collaboration with the Business eLearning team. From video and podcast creation to online tutorials, our students have access to the spaces and equipment necessary to be a digital leader in the world of business.

GEORGE MOORE DIGITAL COLLABORATION ROOM

This 66-seat digitised cooperative learning space will facilitate live business simulations, game-based learning, case assignments, interactive data analysis and team activities to nurture digital, and real-life collaboration skills.

SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS

Knowing that life in a large university environment can be challenging, UCD and the Quinn School provide a range of supports to help our students adapt to life in college.

SCHOOL OFFICE

The School Office is the place for students to go for all queries relating to their course. All programmes have a dedicated Programme Manager based in the UCD Quinn School who will be a key support for all students during their time in UCD.

PEER MENTORS

Peer Mentors are students who have completed first or second year in a similar subject area. They are here to help students integrate into their programme area. Every first year student is linked up with a Peer Mentor during Orientation Week.

MATHS SUPPORT CENTRE

The UCD Maths Support Centre is available to students if required offering additional support either on a one-to-one basis or in small-group tuition.

STUDENT ADVISERS

Student Advisers in UCD provide support to all students throughout their time here but in particular during their first year in college. Students can speak with them in relation to personal, social or practical issues. Our Student Adviser, Jacqueline Levine, can be found next to the School Office.

BUSINESS ACADEMIC WRITING CENTRE

Dr Megan McGurk, Director, at the Business Academic Writing Centre, delivers workshops to Quinn School students on topics related to writing. Through individual and group consultations, Dr McGurk shows writers how to craft a message designed to help an audience make decisions and solve problems.

QUINN INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

The UCD Quinn Internship Programme provides students with an opportunity to put theory and skills learned in the classroom into practice during their degree.

The UCD Quinn Internship Programme is an optional programme which Commerce and Economics & Finance students can apply to participate in. We have partnered with a range of companies from multinational professional services firms to local enterprises, to offer paid internships across a range of business disciplines. Our partners have recognised the high calibre of students coming from the Quinn School and increasingly consider these internship opportunities as a fundamental part of their graduate recruitment strategy.



Our Internship students receive ongoing support and advice from the Internship Manager, Academic Coordinator and Careers Network in the lead up to the application process and throughout the internship year. This includes CV and interview workshops, mock interviews with employers and a pre-internship training day to help prepare for the transition into the workplace.

During the Internship students are registered to a year long online reflective module designed to enhance the learning opportunities available throughout the year.

Assessment is structured on the work-based learning experience during the 9-12 month placement. Successful completion of the internship forms part of the student's Academic Transcript.

INTERNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Recognising the importance of broadening the range of opportunities available to students and the benefit of engaging with our community, the Quinn School recently launched two internship scholarship opportunities: The Quinn Business and Society Internship Scholarship and the Mont Kavanagh Trust Enterprise Internship Scholarship.

Our internship programme is popular among students with 80% of students opting to complete an internship this year.

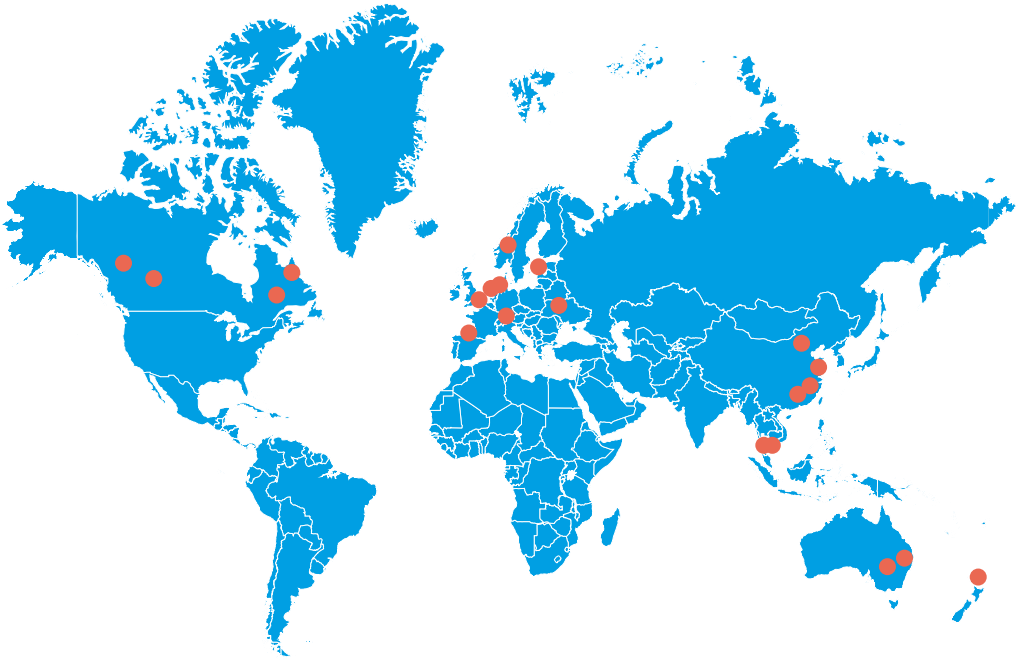

BUSINESS MENTORING PROGRAMME

The UCD Quinn Business Mentoring Programme is an optional programme for students in second year across all undergraduate programmes in the UCD Quinn School.

BUSINESS MENTORING

This is a six month programme running from November to April where undergraduate student mentees are matched with experienced UCD School of Business alumni mentors based on mentor expertise and career areas of interest to the mentees.

The mentoring partnership provides students with an opportunity to gain insights into the business and personal skills required to succeed in today's competitive economy and to increase their confidence and employability through development of professional and interpersonal skills. All of the mentors are experienced alumni from a diverse range of business roles and sector backgrounds, who are committed to sharing professional knowledge and expertise.

90% of students who took part in the mentoring programme felt they had improved their professional skills.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

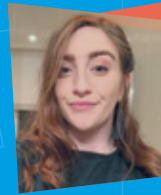
The students and their alumni mentor commit to a minimum of three meetings. In addition to a training session, participants are supported throughout the programme by the Mentoring Manager.

BComm (Hons) (NFQ Level 8)

The UCD Bachelor of Commerce (BComm) degree has a long tradition at the forefront of business and management education in Ireland. The BComm provides a comprehensive and rigorous foundation in core business disciplines, whilst also allowing students to specialise in an area of business expertise.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

The BComm is a globally-recognised business degree, designed for ambitious and achievement-orientated students who want to make a significant impact in the business world. Combining strong theoretical understanding with the practical skills needed for graduate employment, students are reassured of a challenging and relevant course for the modern business world.

You will learn to become an independent and critical thinker and a cogent and compelling communicator; with the skills to work seamlessly in groups; to develop the technical and mathematical skills to analyse and make sense of business data and intelligence.

You will learn about the recent themes and trends transforming the business landscape, such as globalisation, technological change, and environmental sustainability.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

In your first and second year, you will study a wide range of core business disciplines.

This will give you a solid understanding of the foundations of business. You will explore modules through numerous different assessments and project methods, including: case studies, presentations, and business simulations.

In your final year, you will have the option to focus your module choices on a specific business area or you may wish to continue studying modules from across the broad range of business disciplines.

With a wide range of electives, the BComm gives you the flexibility to develop your own personal niche of expertise with a degree of strong industry standing.

BComm students can choose from a catalogue of over 60 optional business modules, including Intro to Cryptocurrencies, Sustainable Finance, Entrepreneurship in Action, Global Marketing, and much more.

Throughout their studies BComm students will develop a critical awareness of business trends, issues, and developments and learn to demonstrate a strong analytical orientation towards decision-making and problem-solving.

Commerce International (BCIT) combines a flexible business education from Ireland's leading business school with the linguistic skills and cultural understanding to succeed in the exciting world of international business.



WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

Students of the BCIT course are well-grounded in the theory and practice of business management and equipped to understand and comment critically on business issues. To achieve a truly global perspective on business, it is necessary to immerse yourself in the culture and not just learn the vocabulary. Students are brought to a high level of language proficiency and cultural sensitivity, which enables them to live abroad for a year and to study business through their chosen language. While this immersive experience is a demanding challenge, education experts have shown that these multicultural competencies are strongly linked with innovative thinking and creative performance.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

On applying, you will select two languages to study, choosing from Chinese, French, German, Italian or Spanish. With the exception of French, you will have the opportunity to study these languages from beginner level. At the end of the first trimester, students choose one of the two options to pursue as their language minor for the remainder of the course. While the European language options include a focus on literature and culture, the Chinese language option encompasses culture, politics, law and society.

Throughout the duration of the course, you will receive a firm foundation in core and specialist business disciplines, as well as developing your language proficiency to degree minor level.

INTERNATIONAL YEAR ABROAD

The year studying abroad at one of our highly regarded international business school partner universities is an integral part of the BCIT programme. When studying abroad in third year you will have two options:

The Modern Languages Route

With the European language minors, you will study business modules through the chosen language for the year, while the Chinese minor involves one trimester studying Chinese language and a second trimester studying business through English.

The Global Business Route

You will study international business abroad through English at one of our partner universities. In fourth year when you return to UCD, you will no longer study a language, but will concentrate solely on business subjects.

In third year, whether at home or abroad, you will also have an opportunity to participate in the BCIT summer internship module, and avail of academic credit for this experiential learning.

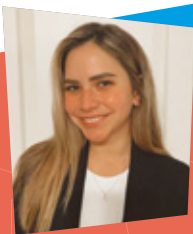

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

If you have a strong interest or ability in economics, maths and statistics, this degree provides everything you need for a future career in the areas of financial economics, banking and finance.

The skills that this course develops are valuable on their own in many careers and provide the essential background for learning Economics and Finance.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

First Year - Develop Your Knowledge

During the first year of this course, you will develop your knowledge and understanding of core principles, concepts, methods and theories relevant to the study of Economics and Finance.

The emphasis initially will be on quantitative methods (Maths and Statistics) and Economics to build solid academic foundations on which competencies in Business and Finance will be advanced throughout the course.

Year 2 & Final Year - Apply This Knowledge

You will then learn to apply this knowledge to practical and important problems faced by businesses and policy makers in a broad range of settings in the financial industry.

In final year, depending on your area of interest you can specialise in the module areas of Economics, Finance or Maths & Statistics.

The Finance stream places emphasis on problems and applications relevant to the financial industry and corporate financial management.

If you choose the Economics or Maths & Stats stream, the emphasis will instead be on different aspects of economic analysis and quantitative methods needed to support (as a consultant or an analyst) and undertake (as a manager or a policy-maker) decision-making in a corporate or policy-making setting.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

BBL graduates are uniquely equipped with the numeracy and financial literacy of a business degree combined with the analytical and advocacy skills that arise from legal training.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

First, Second & Third Year

During your first three years, you will study both business and law modules in equal measure and you will learn how these two disciplines interrelate. The broad range of business modules includes:

- Accountancy
- Management
- Finance
- Economics & Marketing

In addition to studying core Law degree subjects, such as Contract Law, Tort Law and EU Law, you may choose from a large variety of other law modules including:

- Criminal Law
- Revenue Law
- Commercial Law
- Intellectual Property
- Employment Law

Fourth Year

According to your preference and career plans, you can choose to specialise in Business or Law. Students choosing to focus more on the business side in their subject choice can pursue careers in corporate finance, management, accountancy or business analysis, with many graduates pursuing entrepreneurial pathways. BBL students can select the modules necessary for legal professional recognition, which allows them to go on to qualify as a solicitor or barrister, and work in legal practices in Ireland or abroad.

Note: The intensive nature of the BBL degree means that you will not have time to take extra modules as part of UCD Horizons.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

You can combine work, study and family commitments through a more flexible approach to your learning here at UCD. Our business diploma and degree programmes involve a blend of home study and monthly campus attendance, underpinned by an infrastructure of student supports.

The course is delivered through part-time weekend attendance on campus and home study. Attendance on campus is scheduled in two-day blocks (Fridays and Saturdays) over six weekends in each academic year.

After the first two years, successful participants will be awarded a Diploma in Business Studies (NFQ Level 7) and, after a further two years, a Bachelor of Business Studies Hons (NFQ Level 8).

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will develop a solid, conceptual understanding of business and organisational management, along with the knowledge application, communication and leadership skills necessary for the modern business environment.

First & Second Year

In the first two years, you'll be introduced to the fundamentals of management. You'll gain a thorough understanding of the main business disciplines and the principles of management in an Irish and global context. This stage of the course introduces you to the key business functions, including:

Management • The Future of Work & Organisations
• People Management • Accounting • Business Law

• Economics • Digital Business & Social Media Strategy • Marketing Management.

We also have two academic skills modules, designed specifically to help and support you as you return to education.

Third and Fourth Year

In the Degree stage, you'll be introduced to the functions of strategic management. You will explore key aspects of modern business organisation, including:

Business Strategy • Supply Chain Management & Sustainability • HRM • Enterprise & Innovation
• Strategic Decision Making • Financial Management
• Global Business. You will also have the opportunity to undertake a major project in a self-selected area of business management that allows you to develop industry specific knowledge in your selected field.

CAREER AND GRADUATE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates have the opportunity to progress in their current organisations / industries or move in to completely new sectors and roles. Graduates work in a range of industries including pharmaceuticals, banking, healthcare, insurance, hospitality and tourism, education/training, marketing, IT and telecoms, and customer service.

On completion of the Bachelor of Business studies graduates will have obtained a degree of high industry standing that allows them to progress to a variety of postgraduate programmes such as an MBA or more specialised postgraduate study in project management, business strategy, HRM, management, marketing, etc.

PROGRAMME DETAILS

Length of Course

2 Years (DBS) + 2 Years (BBS)

ENTRY ROUTES:

A flexible admissions policy is in place, with two routes of entry; one based on mature years, life experience and academic aptitude and the second based upon matriculation (i.e., Leaving Certificate).

Option One: Mature Years To qualify on the basis of mature years, you must be at least 23 years of age on the 1st January of the proposed year of entry. Suitability will be based on age, work and life experience that is relevant to the course, and academic aptitude. The assessment process may include an interview and a writing skills test.

Option Two: Matriculation

To qualify on the basis of matriculation, you must be 21 on the 1st January of the proposed year of entry. To matriculate on the results of the Leaving Certificate, a student must present at least six subjects selected according to course requirements (Irish, English, Mathematics, and any two subjects accepted for matriculation not already selected) and must obtain a minimum of grade H5 (HD1) in two subjects and a minimum of grade O6/H7 (OD3/HE) in the remaining four subjects.

Applicants with a HETAC ordinary degree or a national/higher certificate (level 6) or diploma in business (level 7 qualification) or an equivalent may be eligible for exemptions.
