




Context

DRAM10030 The Theatrical Event: Case Studies in Making Theatre

In Small Group Teaching groups students will learn about selected aspects of live performance, principles of space and design, audience responses and dramaturgy. Students will visit a performance and write an analysis of what they have seen.

Learning Outcomes:

- → Gain a broad understanding of the cultural contexts for theatre across cultures and in Ireland
- → Define and identify key creative roles in making theatre, including the role of the audience
- → Distinguish and evaluate key contributions in collaborative work
- → Begin to critique the theatrical event, and the cultural and artistic roles of theatre and performance
- → Experience and test selected skills in making theatre.

Example German Modules Competencies

- → Lateral thinking skills: who is my audience? interculturally? Not only what am I going to say but how I need to pitch it?
- → Work in two directions: flexibility, perspective
- → Translation module redacting, editing teams
- → Using the disjunct between the two languages to insist on reflection peer teaching assessment
- → Short form writing core to assessment: ad copy, funding-bid copy, advocacy copy
- → Importance of the story: fundamental to hur human interactions, fundamental to humanities education


