THE QUINN EXPERIENCE

The UCD Quinn School is a progressive and engaging environment, which places a strong emphasis on independent thought.

The experience of studying here is like no other. You will work with the best business students from around the world. You will meet some of the world's leading employers and interact with leading research-active lecturers. Our focus is not only on providing education, but also on the skills necessary to succeed in the working world. Together our Quinn and Moore wings create a community-focused epicentre on the UCD campus for our students, and a space purpose built for business education, formal and informal connecting, collaborating and continuous development.

COLLABORATION STUDIOS

Our collaboration studios have the latest audiovisual technology to train and practice your presentation and communication skills. In these spaces you can record and practice your pitches and presentations for group work or as interview preparation.

THINK LAB

Our Think Lab is a 16-person dedicated space for hands-on experimentation, problem solving and design thinking focused on innovation and teamwork. Designed to mimic the future of work in collaborative teams, the space is equipped with the tools needed for successful group work.

EXTENSIVE CO-WORKING SPACES

At the heart of the Quinn School is the idea of belonging, collaboration, co-working and side-by-side learning, inside and outside the classroom. Areas such as the Moore Atrium contain a rich mix of solo and collaborative working and social spaces for our students.

During the Programme students are registered to a year long online reflective module designed to enhance the learning opportunities available throughout the year. Assessment is structured on the work-based learning experience during the 9-12 month placement. Successful completion of the internship forms part of the student's Academic Transcript. Not only has my internship taught me about HR and how a successful business operates, but it has also helped me discover a lot about myself. I walked into John Sisk & Son on my first day, really shy and scared about making mistakes, but now I am much more



mature and confident. The internship is an opportunity to apply what you have learned in a safe environment where mistakes are expected – rather than learn the hard way in your first job out of college!

BComm (Hons) (NFQ Level 8) CAO CODE: DN650

The UCD Bachelor of Commerce (BComm) degree has a long tradition at the forefront of business and management education in Ireland. The BComm provides a comprehensive and rigorous foundation in core business disciplines, whilst also allowing students to specialise in an area of business expertise.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

The BComm is a globally recognised business degree, designed for ambitious and achievement-orientated students who want to make a significant impact in the business world. Combining strong theoretical understanding with the practical skills needed for graduate employment, students are assured of a challenging and relevant course for the modern business world.

You will learn to become an independent and critical thinker and a cogent and compelling communicator; with the skills to work seamlessly in groups; to develop the technical and mathematical skills to analyse and make sense of business data and intelligence. You will learn about the recent themes and trends transforming the business landscape, such as globalisation, technological change, and environmental sustainability.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

In your first and second year, you will study a wide range of core business disciplines.

This will give you a solid understanding of the foundations of business. You will explore modules through numerous different assessments and project methods, including: case studies, presentations, and business simulations.

In your final year, you will have the option to focus your module choices on a specific business area or you may wish to continue studying modules from across the broad range of business disciplines.

With a wide range of electives, the BComm gives you the flexibility to develop your own personal niche of expertise with a degree of strong industry standing.

BACHELOR OF COMMERCE INTERNATIONAL

BComm (Hons) (International) (NFQ Level 8) CAO CODE: DN660

Commerce International (BCIT) combines a flexible business education from Ireland's leading business school with the linguistic skills and cultural understanding to succeed in the exciting world of international business.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

Students of the BCIT course are wellgrounded in the theory and practice of business management and equipped to understand and comment critically on business issues. To achieve a truly global perspective on business, it is necessary to immerse yourself in the culture and not just learn the vocabulary. Students are brought to a high level of language proficiency and cultural sensitivity, which enables them to live abroad for a year and to study business through their chosen language. While this immersive experience is a demanding challenge, education experts have shown that these multicultural competencies are strongly linked with innovative thinking and creative performance.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

On applying, you will select two languages to study, choosing from Chinese, French,

German, Italian or Spanish. With the exception of French (H4 requirement), you will have the opportunity to study these languages from beginner level. At the end of the first trimester, students choose one of the two options to pursue as their language minor for the remainder of the course. While the European language options include a focus on literature and culture, the Chinese language option encompasses culture, politics, law and society.

Throughout the duration of the course, you will receive a firm foundation in core and specialist business disciplines, as well as developing your language proficiency to degree minor level.

INTERNATIONAL YEAR ABROAD

The year studying abroad is an integral part of the BCIT course. You will spend the year studying at one of our highly regarded international business school partners. With the European language minors, you will study business modules through the chosen language for the year, while the Chinese minor involves one trimester studying Chinese language and a second trimester studying business through English. CAREERS AND GRADUATE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

BCIT graduates find employment in the private, public and not-for-profit (NGO) sectors, or set up their own companies. Many different career paths are available, and students who can combine an international language with a business qualification are highly employable graduates for multinational companies. In addition, the focus on multicultural competencies gives BCIT graduates a unique competitive advantage in the global marketplace.

Recognised as one of the premier degrees in its field in Ireland and internationally, it equips students with outstanding expertise in quantitative methods, analytical skills and a rigorous preparation in economics and finance.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

If you have a strong interest or ability in economics, maths and statistics, this degree provides everything you need for a future career in the areas of financial economics, banking and finance.

The skills that the course develops are valuable on their own in many careers and provide the essential background for learning Economics and Finance.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

First Year - Develop Your Knowledge During the first year of this course, you will develop your knowledge and understanding of core principles, concepts, methods and theories relevant to the study of Economics and Finance. The emphasis initially will be on quantitative methods (Maths and Statistics) and Economics to build solid academic foundations on which competencies in Business and Finance will be advanced throughout the course.

Year 2 & Final Year - Apply This Knowledge

You will then learn to apply this knowledge to practical and important problems faced by businesses and policy makers in a broad range of settings in the financial industry.

In final year, depending on your area of interest you can specialise in the module areas of Economics, Finance or Maths. The Finance stream places emphasis on problems and applications relevant to the financial industry and corporate financial management.

If you choose the Economics or Maths & Stats stream, the emphasis will be instead on different aspects of economic analysis and quantitative methods needed to support (as a consultant or an analyst) and undertake (as a manager or a policy-maker) decision-making in a corporate or policy-making setting.

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

BBL graduates are uniquely equipped with the analytical and advocacy skills that arise from a legal training, combined with the numeracy and financial literacy of a business degree.

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

First, Second & Third Year

During your first three years, you will study both business and law modules in equal measure and you will learn how these two disciplines interrelate. In addition to studying core Law degree subjects, such as Contract Law, Tort Law and EU Law, you may choose from a large variety of other law modules including: Criminal Law • Revenue Law • Commercial Law • Intellectual Property Law • Employment Law The range of business modules includes:

Accountancy • Management • Finance • Economics • Marketing

Fourth Year

According to your preference and career plans, you can choose to specialise in Law or Business. BBL students can select the modules necessary for legal professional recognition, which allows them to go on to qualify as a solicitor or barrister, and work in legal practices in Ireland or abroad. Alternatively students may choose to focus more on the business side in their subject choice and pursue careers in accountancy, management, corporate finance or business analysis. You'll attend lectures and tutorials. in addition to engaging in study and preparatory work.


Note: The intensive nature of the BBL degree means that you will not have time to take extra modules as part of UCD Horizons.

DIPLOMA/ BACHELOR OF BUSINESS STUDIES

(NFQ Level 7 / NFQ Level 8) NON-CAO COURSE

WHY IS THIS COURSE FOR ME?

You can combine work, study and family commitments through a more flexible approach to your learning here at UCD. Our business diploma and degree courses involve a blend of home study and monthly campus attendance, underpinned by an infrastructure of student supports. The course is delivered through part-time weekend attendance on campus and home study. Attendance on campus is scheduled in two-day blocks (Fridays and Saturdays) over six weekends in each academic year. After the first two years, successful participants will be awarded a Diploma in Business Studies (NFO Level 7) and, after a further two years, a Bachelor of Business Studies Hons (NFQ Level 8).

WHAT WILL I STUDY?

You will develop a solid, conceptual understanding of business and organisational management, along with the knowledge application, communication and leadership skills necessary for the modern business environment.

FIRST AND SECOND YEAR

In the first two years, you'll be introduced to the fundamentals of management. You'll gain a thorough understanding of the main business disciplines and the principles of management in an Irish and global context. This stage of the course introduces you to the key business functions, including: Management • The Future of Work & Organisations • People Management • Accounting • Business Law • Economics • Digital Business & Social Media Strategy • Marketing Management. We also have two academic skills modules, designed specifically to help and support you as you return to education.

THIRD AND FOURTH YEAR

In the Degree stage, you'll be introduced to the functions of strategic management. You will explore key aspects of modern business organisation, including: Business Strategy • Supply Chain Management & Sustainability • HRM • Enterprise & Innovation • Strategic Decision Making • Financial Management •Global Business. You will also have the opportunity to undertake a major project in a self-selected area of business management that allows you to develop industry specific knowledge in your selected field.

CAREER AND GRADUATE STUDY OPPORTUNITIES

Graduates will progress to rewarding and challenging employment in industries including administration, banking, insurance and financial management, education/ training, engineering and construction, healthcare, hospitality and tourism, IT and telecoms, marketing and media, and retail, sales and customer services.

Roles may include technical, operational or managerial positions. On completion of the Bachelor of Business Studies, graduates are eligible to apply for a variety of postgraduate programmes including business strategy, project management, etc.

Programme Details

Length of Course: 2 Years (DBS) + 2 Years (BBS)

Entry Routes:

A flexible admissions policy is in place, with two routes of entry; one based on mature years, life experience and academic aptitude and the second based upon matriculation (i.e., Leaving Certificate).

Option One: Mature Years

To qualify on the basis of mature years, you must be at least 23 years of age on the 1st January of the proposed year of entry. Suitability will be based on age, work and life experience that is relevant to the course, and academic aptitude. The assessment process may include an interview and a writing skills test.

Option Two: Matriculation

To qualify on the basis of matriculation, you must be 21 on the 1st January of the proposed year of entry. To matriculate on the results of the Leaving Certificate, a student must present at least six subjects selected according to course requirements (Irish, English, mathematics, and any two subjects accepted for matriculation not already selected) and must obtain a minimum of grade H5 (HD1) in two subjects and a minimum of grade O6/H7 (OD3/HE) in the remaining four subjects.

Fees

The "Free Fees Initiative" does not apply to this course. Please see www.ucd.ie/fees for information. I decided to enrol in the BBS course late in my career, partly as a personal objective and partly to focus on career progress. With more than 20 years of business experience behind me, I was unsure as to how much knowledge I would gain from the course. However, the past 4 years has been a fantastic



journey of learning and forging new friendships. The course content is designed to perfectly match the needs of a modern business leader and each module has the right balance of lectures, course work and project work to enable you to fit it in with a busy work schedule. The lecturers are great with a wealth of knowledge from both real world business experience and academia. My own personal growth from the course was far beyond my expectations. It was relevant, enjoyable and challenged my thinking throughout.
